



# Musée d'Orsay

**The history of the museum, of its building is quite unusual.**

In the centre of Paris on the banks of the River Seine, opposite the Tuileries Gardens, the museum was installed in the former Orsay railway station, built for the Universal Exhibition of 1900.

The building itself could be seen as the first «work of art» in the Musée d'Orsay, which displays collections of art from the period 1848 to 1914.





# Musée de l'Orangerie

**Located in the heart of Paris, and built as a greenhouse in 1852** to shelter the orange trees decorating the Tuileries Palace garden during the winter, the Musée de l'Orangerie is built on the garden's terrace bordering the River Seine. Since 1922, it is home to the masterpieces gifted to France by Claude Monet himself.

In addition to Monet's *Water Lilies*, there are also works by great masters such as Cézanne, Renoir, Picasso, Rousseau and Matisse.






# Bibliothèque nationale de France Reception areas

# Les jardins du Château de Versailles

# Château de Versailles

# Château de Versailles Grand Café d'Orléans and its private salons

The Grand Café d'Orléans is located in the South Wing, also called the Wing of the Princes. It was built by Jules Hardouin-Mansart between 1676 and 1681 as a residence for the royal children.

In this majestic and contemporary 700m<sup>2</sup> space, lit by sunlight, the Grand Café d'Orléans has salons that lead on from one another. They are available for private hire and can be used for all types of private or professional events: breakfasts, group lunches, cocktail lunches or dinners, and special evening meals when visiting for the Night Fountains Show.




